Launched at the 4th International Conference on Environment Education (EE), Ahmedabad, 2007, Handprint is a tool to indicate to ourselves the ESD actions we take. It is a tool that measures action at the individual, community, national and global level.

Through the SDG Handprint Lab, the students of institutes which enroll in it will become a part of the larger South Asia Youth Environment Network (SAYEN). Supported by the UNEP Regional Office, Asia and the Pacific; SAYEN is linked to UNEP's strategy for engaging young people in environmental activities and in the work of UNEP.
